1 Introductions

All manuscripts must be in Lithuanian or English. All authors must provide their name, surname, full address, e-mail, summary, keywords, main text, conclusions and references. Papers must be submitted electronically in either PDF or .doc.

2 Detailed requirements

2.1 Formatting

The text must be presented in A4 format document, in one column and single line spacing. Abstract and keywords are presented at the top of the document, directly after the authors names and addresses. Page numbering, header and footer are not necessary.

2.2 Margins

Left, right and top margins - 2,5 cm, bottom margin - 2 cm. First line indentation -1,25 cm.

2.3 Text formatting

Times Roman or similar font may be used in the document.

Figure captions should be below the figures and aligned to the centre. Table labels should appear above the tables and be aligned to the right. Table headers should appear above the tables. Table font size -10 pt.

Insert figures and tables after they are cited in the text. Use the abbreviation "Fig. 1", even at the beginning of a sentence. We suggest that you use a text box to insert a graphic (ideally 300 dpi), with all fonts embedded).
