The CyberAgent consortium recently held its second project management meeting on June 11th and 12th, hosted at the EVM headquarters in Tenerife, Spain. Over two days, partners engaged in productive discussions and collaborative sessions. Here are some of the highlights:

Day 1 (June 11, 2024)

Opening and Overview

The meeting commenced with an introduction to the agenda and the expected outcomes. The overall summary of the CyberAgent Project, including the current project plan and milestones, was presented by Vilnius University (VU).

WP2 Update

Olemisen provided updates on deliverables related to SME Cyber Security Change Agents training needs mapping, implementation requirements, and the CyberAgent collaboration platform.

WP3 Planning and Organisations

VU and TIMTAL discussed the development of eight training modules at HEI and VET levels, along with designing training materials. The process of module evaluation and approval was also addressed.

Feedback and Sharing

Partners shared examples of good practices, including gamification elements and pedagogical

aspects from various projects.

Day 2 (June 12, 2024)

WP4 Planning

PRIOS focused on planning the UI/UX platform prototype design and testing.

WP5 Update

EVM reported on the formalization of local and regional networks.

WP6 Dissemination and Exploitation P6

Women4Cyber discussed stakeholder engagement plans, communication strategies, and recommendations for improvement.

WP1 Progress Report

VU provided a status update and quality assurance assessment.

The meeting concluded with personal consultations, evaluation, and a summary led by EVM.
